Temporary Suspension of Custody Visits

### 1. Background

Physical custody visits were suspended in March 2020, following government guidance. In May 2020 this decision was reviewed, when it was decided to review the decision should the Covid-19 Alert Level change from four to three. The reduction in the Alert Level from four to three occurred in June 2020, and in July 2020 it was decided to return to physical visits, following the introduction of new guidelines and risk assessment. Physical visits took place in August and September. Custody visitors made visits following these guidelines reported no concerns for their safety or for the safety of detainees or custody staff. Virtual visits through skype have continued since April 2020. Further scrutiny of police custody records took place between April – July. On 21 September 2020 the government raised the Alert Level from three to four, and as a result the decision was taken to suspend physical visits until the Alert Level reduces to three.

## 2. Decision record

2.1 The decision will be reviewed again once the Covid-19 Alert level reduces to level three, together with a review of risk assessments drawn up in conjunction with force health and safety and the protocols put in place that would govern any change to visiting arrangements. Virtual visits via Skype will continue, with an intended increase from one per month per custody suite to two per month per custody suite.
