1. Background

- 1.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner is required to issue a Police and Crime Plan as soon as practicable after taking office and, in any case, before the end of the financial year (31st March) in which the Commissioner is elected.
- 1.2 Following re-election in May 2021, the Commissioner drafted her objectives and priorities for her next Police and Crime Plan with a continued emphasis on Safe, Resilient and Connected communities.
- 1.3 A consultation and engagement period took place in summer 2021 to gather feedback from key stakeholders, partners and members of the public on the draft objectives and priorities.
- 1.4 Following consideration of early feedback from stakeholders and members of the public the Commissioner issued her draft plan to the Police and Crime Panel for consideration and feedback at the panel meeting on 17th September 2021
- 1.5 The Police and Crime Panel provided their feedback on the draft plan for the Commissioner's consideration. The Commissioner formally wrote to the Chair of the Police and Crime Panel on 5th November 2021 with her response to the feedback, and where appropriate made amendments to the draft Police and Crime Plan.
- 1.6 At the Police and Crime Panel meeting on the 12th November 2021, the Commissioner formally issued the Police and Crime Panel with the finalised Police and Crime Plan.

- 2.1 The Commissioner decided to approve and issue her finalised Police and Crime Plan 2021 - 2025 for Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.
