### 1. Background

1.1 Elemental UK and The Dracaena Centre will work in Partnership through the U+ programme to provide a preventative and aspirational Youth Work approach for vulnerable young people on the verge of, or beginning to be involved in, disruptive and harmful anti-social behaviour. The two organisations have a history of collaborative working to support some of the more vulnerable young people in the Falmouth and Penryn community network area.

This is a pilot project which will be delivered over a 6-month period (January – June 2021 inclusive) to 108 vulnerable young people and will inform a follow-on project with a wider reach across Cornwall and Devon.

#### 2. Decision Record

2.1 That the PCC, in collaboration with the Chief Constable funds allocates £39892 to the U+ programme, with the potential for a second opprtunity of funding to be made available if the outcomes metrics show tangible progress in line with the Prevention of Serious Violence Programmes declared aims.
