1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 A programme of essential maintenance and station improvements is required to Camborne Police Station in order to ensure the accommodation is fit to provide the best possible service to our communities and to support the wellness of the Police Officers and staff located in the station.
- 1.2 Camborne Police Station is a freehold property constructed in 1960 which contains custody. The refurbishment programme will provide a single holistic approach and focus on improved standards of the building whilst ensuring compliance with a range of Health and Safety requirements. The new design will include all efforts to improve access in the building for both the public and staff.
- 1.3 The programme of refurbishment works have been costed and financial provision within the Capital Budget for the required level of expenditure has been agreed.
- 1.4 The delivery of the project will contribute to the priority of 'getting the best out of the police'. The resources to benefit from the improvements in this project are varied but all contribute to the objectives of preventing and deterring crime, and protecting the vulnerable. In addition, the final phase will realise an improved Public Enquiry Office facility, thereby supporting our goal of better connectivity

2.0 DECISION RECORD

2.1 The proposed capital budget expenditure of approximately £1.7m is agreed.

3.0 CONSULTATION, ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATION

3.1 Governance will be provided by the local strategic group with membership including the BCU Commander, Head of Estates and OPCC Treasurer. The project will be delivered by the Major Projects Team in consultation with the West Cornwall Property Forums and Governance Board.
