Executive Summary

Following consideration of the final business case for the potential merger of Devon and Cornwall Police and Dorset Police, the PCC for Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly confirmed her decision that she does not support the decision to submit the business case to the Home Office. The PCC did not support the submission of the Final Business Case for merger to the Home Office for two primary reasons: concerns around the council tax precept and the lack of public support for the proposals.

The PCC made it public that she was minded to say no to pursuing the merger and then took this "minded to" decision to the Devon and Cornwall Police and Crime Panel meeting on the 5th October 2018. This Panel meeting included in the papers an abridged version of the Final Business Case and a summary of the public and stakeholder engagement results.

Following the panel meeting the PCC announced her final decision which was not to support the submission of the Final Business Case to the Home Office.

Recommendation

The final business case for a merger between Devon and Cornwall Police and Dorset Police is not supported by the PCC for Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly and on that basis, without unanimous agreement by all 4 corporations sole, the business case will not be submitted to the Home Office.
