### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Torbay Council submitted an application for a capital grant from the PCC to support the cost of installing a CCTV camera at Beacon Cove.

### 2. DECISION RECORD

- 2.1 The OPCC will award £1,500 to Torbay Council towards the total cost of a CCTV camera installation at Beacon Cove.

### 3. CONSULTATION, ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Prior to approval of the grant award, the proposal to purchase a CCTV camera for Torbay (Beacon Cove) was discussed with the local Police. This provided assurance that there would be an operational benefit if a CCTV system was installed.

### 4. OPCC MONITORING OFFICER ADVICE

#### 4.1 Legal, Management and Equality Implications – Current and Future

The PCC's Chief Executive and Monitoring Officer has advised that the arrangements set out in the proposal meet the requirements of the PCC's CCTV Investment Strategy and the criteria for awarding capital grants.

The PCC's CEO and Monitoring Officer has advised that this decision is within the powers of those making it and that, from the information provided, there would not appear to be any adverse legal, managerial or equality implications arising from the proposal.

#### 4.2 Financial and Commercial – Current and Future



The PCC's Chief Finance Officer and S151 Officer has advised that the financial requirements of this Decision are consistent with the criteria of the CCTV Investment Strategy and delivers against the PCC's Police and Crime Plan priorities.

The PCC's Chief Finance Officer and S151 Officer has advised that the financial implications of this Decision are set out in the Executive Summary and/or the attached report. The decision will ensure that the PCC meets their legislative requirements in relation to the Police element of the precept and will also ensure that there is sufficient funding available in 2019/20 to fund the organisation to deliver against the Police and Crime Plan priorities.

The PCC's Chief Finance Officer and S151 Officer has advised that the financial implications are set out within this decision and are both reasonable and deliverable. This will help support the organisation in its drive to be as efficient and effective as possible.


