Allocation of grant funding for road safety interventions to reduce killed and serious injuries in Cornwall

***Addendum 16/06/2020:** Due to Covid restrictions, the Cornwall Community Foundation have not been in a position to be able to distribute all of this fund to the intended recipients – a portion of which had been intended for schools to benefit. The PCC has agreed that the balance remaining of £6,739 from the original fund of £25,000 should therefore be given to the Cornwall Community Foundation's Covid Emergency Fund instead.*

## 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner administers funds under the Police Property Act. The PCC has determined that £10,000 of this years Property Act funding along with a discretionary sum of £15,000 be made available to Cornwall Community Foundation to distribute as grant funding to community groups with a particular focus on improving road safety before the end of the current financial year.

- 3.1 This decision was taken having regard to previous grant arrangements for the benefit of communities in Cornwall with CCF, advice from the Force and legal requirements associated with the distribution of Police Property Act funds.

The PCC's Chief Executive and Monitoring Officer has advised that the arrangements set out in the proposal meet the requirements of the relevant legislation and the needs of the organisation. The allocation of funding also meets with requirements of the new Peninsula Road Safety Partnership Group, which is Chaired by the PCC and whose first intervention has prioritised Cornwall for a targeted partnership activity.
