
Q1 What age category are you in?




Q2 What council tax band is your household?


Q3 What is your ethnic group? (Please select from the dropdown list below)


Q4 What district do you live in?

Q7 Drones have provided key front line services, from searching for missing people to surveillance. At the same time that drones are in the ascendancy, the National Police Air Service (NPAS) is struggling to provide an affordable and sustainable effective helicopter service.
