# A renewed focus on community priorities

**Dear householder**, this leaflet explains how Devon and Cornwall Police will be funded for the next financial year, the implications for your council tax bill and strategic direction of the force.

The Police and Crime Panel unanimously supported my proposal to increase the police precept (the element of council tax bills which pays for policing) by a below inflation 6%.

The increase and national funding will enable our new Chief Constable Will Kerr to move towards our shared vision of a police force that is better connected to the communities we

The 2023/24 force budget of **£384m** is made up from council tax precept payments and a Government grant. Band D household police precepts will be **£261.56** in 2023/24 – **£15** more than in 2022/23. Other council tax bands
