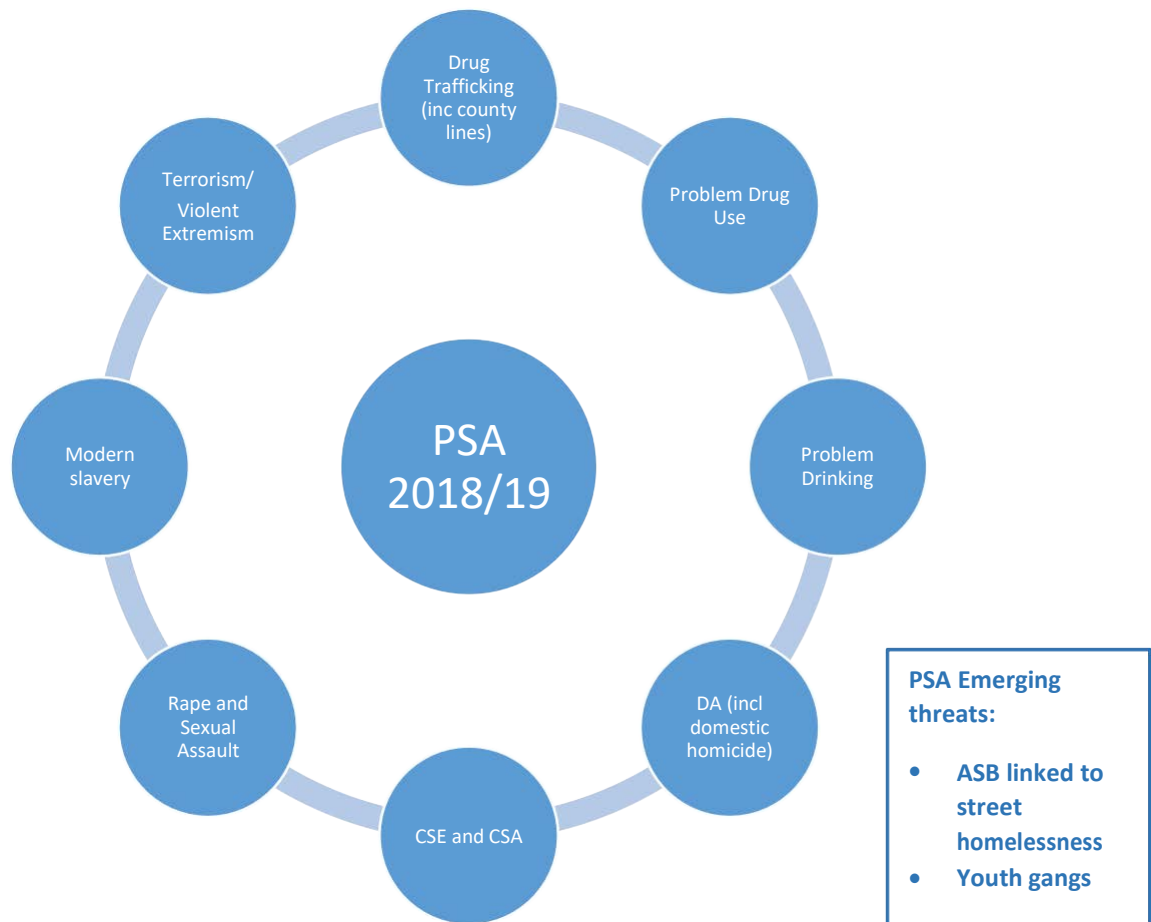


Delivering the Police & Crime Plan in Torbay – 2018/19



Police and Crime Plan Initiatives in Torbay

- **CCTV.**
 - Upgrading of Torquay CCTV and control room nearing completion. Paignton and Brixham to start spring 2019. **£60,000 paid by PCC**
 - Torbay working with several towns (incl. Dawlish, Teignmouth and Exmouth) to develop Torbay as a CCTV Monitoring Hub.
- **Councillor Advocates Scheme** – 3 councillor advocates in Torbay
- New **Basic Command Unit** set up for South Devon to secure a stronger focus on crime issues in the local area
- **Road Safety** – 28 additional roads policing officers across D&C including a No Excuses Team, dedicated Road Casualty Reduction Officers for the new BCU and one for Highways England Network. Renewing of Community Speedwatch and investment in systems and services to support growth.

OPCC Commissioning and Grants Specific to Torbay:

Funding	2018/19 Allocation
Community Safety Partnership (CSP)	Torbay CSP received: £201,575 – helping to fund a number of key services including; Sexual violence and Domestic Abuse, Safeguarding and Substance Misuse. This funding has been used as follows: £26,000 – domestic violence and sexual abuse services £3000 – Domestic homicide reviews £56,700 – substance misuse services £35,600 – Reducing reoffending £40,000 – ASB £6600 – Alcohol/NTE ARID £6000 – Street Pastors Safe Place £10,000 – Awareness raising campaigns £17,675 – Other
Youth Offending Service	Torbay Youth Offending Team received: £65,091 - The PCC intends to maintain funding at the 2017-18 level for two financial years to ensure service delivery in this area can be maintained.
Turning Corners Project – with Teignbridge – Home Office Early Intervention Fund	The Turning Corners Project has been awarded a grant of £528,569 over two years. The grant will support a project that will deploy a Youth Exploitation Tracker Assessment across South Devon to identify those at significant risk of engaging in violence and gang activity, triggering tailored rapid intervention. The project will also support early identification of adverse childhood experiences at transition to secondary education, first time entrants and children at the edge of care to prevent escalation into violence. Although initially starting in South Devon, it is intended that the project will expand throughout Devon.

Wider OPCC Commissioning and Grants

The following commissioning activities benefit all areas across Devon and Cornwall:

Commissioning Area	2018/19 Allocation
Independent Sexual Violence Advocacy Service (ISVA) and SARC Service	£343,610 of funding has been provided by the PCC (includes £83,610 contribution from NHS England).
Mental Health Street Triage and Mental Health Neighbourhood Liaison & Diversion	£250,000 provided by PCC to support crisis response from policing on mental health.
<p>Victims Services Grant from the Ministry of Justice:</p> <p>The PCC receives a ring-fenced amount based on a national population formula of 2.97% for the Devon, Cornwall and Isles of Scilly area.</p>	<p>In 2018/19, the PCC received £1,875,543 Victims Services Grant and £139,862 CSA/CSE Grant so in total: £2,015,267.</p> <p>The Victim Services Grant is used to provide essential support and establishes victim care arrangements. The funding received is utilised to fund in excess of 70 third sector organisations providing tailored support to victims according to need. Examples of Torbay service providers include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Age UK (Torquay): Provide support to elderly victims. • Samaritans of South Devon (Torquay): Provide emotional support. • Sanctuary Supported Living Services; Torbay Domestic Abuse Service (TDAS): Provide support for men, women and children in Torbay who need advice and protection from domestic abuse. • The Children's Society (CheckPoint Torbay Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)): The Torbay service works with families supporting them to reduce the risk of CSE.
Ministry of Justice funded Outreach Support Service	The OPCC were awarded £234,238 for a pilot to deliver an Outreach Support Service for women across Devon & Cornwall which is funded until March 2020. The funding has been divided equally across the three organisations that form the OPCC created Alliance. In Torbay this is: Sunflower Women's Centre (Plymouth) who will employ 2 workers to cover Plymouth and Torbay.
Crimestoppers Manager for Devon and Cornwall	The PCC has provided £20,000 funding per annum to support the appointment of a dedicated Crimestoppers Manager to work with local communities and Crimestoppers volunteers in D&C to enhance the presence and impact of Crimestoppers locally and to support local community campaigns. The new manager took up their post in December 2018.
